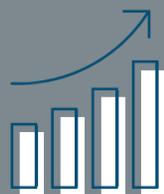
## BEST PRACTICES

**Thoughtfully commit a certain percentage of your income to parish offertory.**

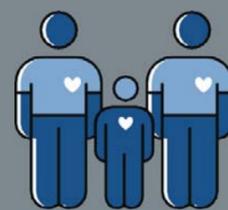
